The Em7 and G are just one strum only. Hit them quick and switch to the next chord.

Am* means that you strum open and then hammer onto Am (the entire chord).

The star * means a hammer-on on the A string while playing the Am chord.

(nothing) means don't strum until the next chord.

(mute) means to just strum the strings muted.
