It s accurate, but I ll offer this suggestion: if you really want to get the sound of the organ for the verses, only play the fifth and octave for the B major and A major chords, and play the root and fifth for the Emajor. The best way to do this is to play the B barre chord up at the seventh fret, then move down two frets for A, and then move back up to the seventh fret for E. When playing like this, \*only play the two notes on the A and D strings for each chord.\*
