Em chord. Just the E string is tabbed here: E:--2-1--|

A quick music factoid - going from Cdim7 to D $\sharp$ dim7, as tabbed here, the chords are actually interchangeable. In other words, Cdim7 is also D $\sharp$ dim7, and vice versa. And both are also F $\sharp$ dim7, and A $\flat$ dim7. By notating the song as 2 different chords, going from Cdim7 to D $\sharp$ dim7, is just a way to show a change. I could have just as well as left it only as Cdim7 or D $\sharp$ dim7.
